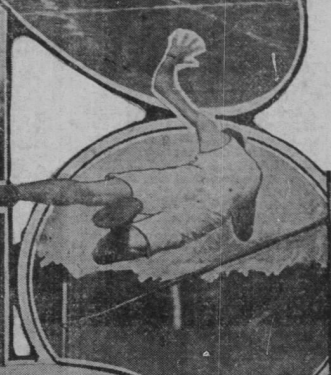
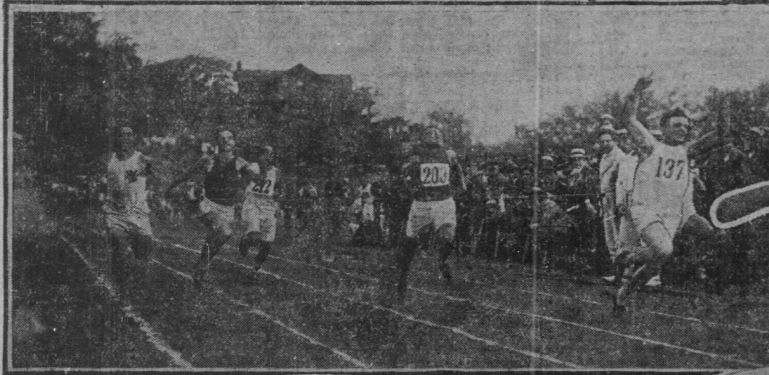


# Snapshots At the A.A.U. Track Meet On Saturday Afternoon
