

TWO HUNDRED MERMEN AND MERMAIDS ENTERED FOR GREAT VICTORY MEET TO BE HELD IN HARBOR, MAY 30-31

Duke Kahanamoku to Swim Unattached—"Ludy" Langer Lines Up With Hui Nalu—W. W. Harris Jr., Goes With Outrigger—Service Units Strongly Represented, Also Schools

Two hundred Honolulu mermen and mermaids have been duly entered for the big Victory Swimming Meet which is to be held in the harbor the evenings of Friday and Saturday, May 30 and 31. The list, which is published below for the first time, includes such celebrities as Duke Kahanamoku, "Ludy" Langer, W. W. Harris Jr., Frank S. Kruger, Allan Cunha, John Kelli, George Keavenahi, Lukela Kaupiko and Fred K. Wilhelm among the mermen, and Marion Dowsett, Helen Rosa, Josephine Hopkins, Gerd Hjorth, Erna Tarleton, Ruth L. Seybolt, the Kenn sisters, and Rose Robero among the mermaids.

The general committee in charge of the meet, assisted by officials of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U., has been working hard on the big entry list in an effort to ascertain just who are properly registered and to just what particular club the entrants owe allegiance, for some of the swimmers entered for at least two different clubs. The committee was in session again last night.

It will be noticed that Duke Kahanamoku, sprint champion of the world, will swim unattached. Charles Lambert Jr., is the lone entry of the Signal Corps. The best service swimmers have entered and in this department, particularly, the meet will bring out some keen competition.

The firm of H. F. Wichman & Co., is already at work on the medals, which will be placed on exhibition shortly. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded the winners of first, second and third places in each event. Eleven fine trophy cups have been donated by Honolulu firms and individuals, which will go to the various clubs and relay teams.
