

OUTRIGGER CLUB MAY SEND TEAM

It has merely been voiced as a possibility in order that the head of the clubs might learn the attitude of the club members. It would certainly be fine, is the opinion of the swimming fans in Honolulu, to have the Outrigger send a team and clean up some of these mainland meets.

Marion Dowsett, Outrigger club swimmer, probably doesn't know it, but she made the 50 yards recently in 29 seconds and equaled the world's record of Fanny Durack according to the New York Globe of May 22, which says:

"Miss Marion Dowsett of Honolulu thrashed 50 yards recently in 29 seconds, equaling the international record held by Miss Fannie Durack of Australia, and Hawaiians now look upon her as the coming world's champion in sprint swimming. In view of the new star's brilliant performance, it is particularly interesting to learn that arrangements are being made to send her on a trip to this country and that there is virtual assurance she will pay us a visit during the approaching outdoor season."
