

TEN EVENTS ON SCHEDULE OF FITE-NITE FOR SAILORS

Seats For Thousands To Be Provided At Moiliili Park On Thursday Night

Outrigger Canoe Club Plans To Have 14 Canoes For Entertainment of Men

Athletic entertainment will be one of the big features of the welcome to be extended to the men of the battleship New York and the destroyers. The committee of which Maj. A. L. Castle is chairman has worked hard to prepare a splendid program though they have been somewhat handicapped in view of the fact that no word has been received from the naval division as to what athletic material it has available.

The chief single event of the in town program, as far as the number of men to be entertained is concerned, will be the big fite-nite at Moiliili Park Thursday evening. President J. Ashman Beaven of the Oahu-Service Athletic League is working out the details of this affair and announces that the complete programs of events, except for the names of the participants, has been worked out. The names cannot be made public until the participants from the ships are known.

Program of Events

The program as already arranged will run as follows:

1. 7:30 p. m.—15 min. wrestling bout.
2. 7:50 p. m.—10 min. Jiu-jitsu exhibition.
3. 8:00 p. m.—3 2-min. rounds of juvenile boxing (Wright brothers).
4. 8:10 p. m.—15 min. wrestling bout.
5. 8:30 p. m.—4 rounds boxing.
6. 8:45 p. m.—4 rounds boxing.
7. 9:00 p. m.—4 rounds boxing.
8. 9:15 p. m.—6 rounds boxing.
9. 9:40 p. m.—6 rounds boxing.
10. 10:10 p. m.—10 rounds boxing.

Officials for the affair have been tentatively chosen as follows: Medical Officer, Dr. W. A. DeTuncq; referees and judges to be alternated from the following: Paddy Ryan, A. B. Angus, Johnny Stone, Billy Holmes. Timekeepers, H. N. Mosher and Lester Petrie. For the wrestling the referee will be Dr. A. C. Reinecke and the timekeepers the same as in the boxing events.

Arrange For Thousands

President Beaven is making arrangements to care for several thousand service men and civilians at the fite-nite. The ring will be erected on the diamond about midway between the home plate and the pitcher's box. Around it will be placed about 1000 chairs. The ring will be within full sight of the grandstand and bleachers. The central section of the grandstand will be reserved for ladies and their escorts. Application must be made for special tickets for this section. Autos may be parked in a semi-circle outside the chairs and toward the outfield. No autos will be allowed on the side toward the grandstand and bleachers.
