1. 440-yard, service—Frank Feldman, 14th Submarine Division; R. M. Simonton, 14th Submarine Division; Francis Benefield, Coast Artillery Corps. Time, 6:50.

2. 50-yard, girls' novice—Kuualoha Kelliplo, Hilo; Harriette Carter, Outrigger; Ethel Marston, Outrigger. Time, :36.3.

3. 100-yard, back stroke, men's open—Warren Kealoha, Hui Makani; Harold Kruger, St. Mary's college; George C. Kane, Healani. Time, 1:08.1, equalling Kruger's world's record.

4. 75-yard, breast stroke novice—Jos. Gilman, Hui Makani; John Kua, Jr., Healani; Ah Kong Pang, Hui Nalu. Time, :58.1.

5. Novice spring board diving for boys under 20—Bouldin Burbank, Outrigger; James Whittle, Healani; Earle Vida, Hui Nalu.

6. 50-yard, back stroke, ladies' open—Frances Cowells Schroth, San Francisco; Edith Kenn, Hui Makani; Thelma Kenn, Hui Makani. Time, :40, breaking her own Pacific coast record made at San Diego in 1917.

7. 40-yard, for boys under 13—Isami Matsuda, Palama; Emil Peters, Jr., Palama; Kenneth Makinney, Outrigger. :25.3.

8. 50-yard, men's open—Pua Kealoha, Hui Makani; Warren Kealoha, Hui Makani; Norman Ross, Illinois Athletic club. Time, :25.

9. 220-yard, men's novice—William Pua, Healani; Albert Makinney, Outrigger; James O'Dowda, Outrigger. Time, 2:48.2.

10. 100-yard, ladies' open—Frances Cowells Schroth, San Francisco; Agnes Auld, Palama; Edith Kenn, Hui Makani. Time, 1:09.1.

11. 880-yard, men's open—Norman Ross, Illinois Athletic club; Harold Kruger, St. Mary's college; George Antone, Hui Makani. Time, 11:12.3, breaking American record by :14.3. Ross continued to 1000 yards, making world record of 12:44.3 and breaking old one by :07.2.

12. 440-yard, service relay, 4 men, 100 yards each—Coast Artillery Corps, Sylvester Granrose, Francis Benefield, William H. Hensley and Virgil L. Saunder; 14th Submarine Division, R. M. Simonton, Albert Butzke, Frank Feldman, Daniel Nape. Time, 4:41.2.
