

## Outrigger Canoe Club Girl Repeats; Defeats Frances Cowells Once Again

HILO, Hawaii, Nov. 12.—Coming within :1.2 of the world record for the distance, Ruth Scudder, 13-year-old Outrigger Canoe club girl, defeated Frances Cowells of San Francisco here tonight in the 50-yard breaststroke open race for women. By the victory she demonstrated that her win in Honolulu had not been a fluke. Furthermore, she broke the Hawaiian record that she had set in Honolulu by covering the distance in :45.4.

Norman Ross took first in the 220-yard men's open, with Warren Kealoha

second and W. W. Harris, Jr., third. The time was 2:30  $\frac{4}{5}$ . "Stubby" Kruger took the 100-yard backstroke, men's open, in 1:14  $\frac{2}{5}$ , with George C. Kane second and Pua Kealoha third.

Although defeated in the breaststroke, Cowells took first place in the 100-yard women's open in 1:15  $\frac{2}{5}$ . She kept on swimming for another 50 yards and established an American record for that distance of 2:04  $\frac{4}{5}$ . Edith Kenn of Hui Makani was second in the 100-yard. Agnes Auld of Palama was third.

Norman Ross won a second victory

by taking the 50-yard men's open in :25  $\frac{1}{5}$ , with Warren Kealoha second and Pua Kealoha third.
