

TOWN TEAM PUTS OUTRIGGER CLUB AWAY WITH ZERO

Big Crowd Sees "Scotty" Schuman Aggregation Blank Bill Inman's Surf-Riding Bunch

Bucking the line and skirting the ends to great advantage, "Scotty" Schuman's Town Team whitewashed the Outrigger Canoe club eleven by a 13 to 0 score at Moillili field yesterday afternoon. Upwards of 1200 spectators witnessed the tangle which was one of the cleanest games played this season.

As expected the winners ruled the field as favorites, but to the surprise of the spectators the Outriggers played a wonderful defensive game. From the beginning to the end of the contest, the Townies threatened their opponents' goal. Time and again it looked as if they would come out with at least three or four touchdowns.

First Score

The first score came in the latter part of the second quarter when, after a series of end runs and line bucks that put the ball on the 28 yard line, "Buck" Aarona made a field goal. The first touchdown came as a result of a number of spectacular line plunges by Aarona, who was given the oval six times in succession from the 45 yard line. The former Kamehameha captain thrilled the fans when he dodged and tore through the heavy Outrigger line for consistent gains of five to nine yards. The ball had been advanced to the Surfriders' 11 yard line. With five yards to make first down and 11 yards for a touchdown, Aarona again took the ball and plowed over the line through right tackle. He was knocked out as he crossed but in a minute he got up amid cheers from the crowd. Herman Clark kicked goal. Score: Townies, 10; Outrigger, 0.

Lost Points

The last three points came in the latter minutes of the final quarter. With the ball on the Outriggers' 25 yard line the Townies failed to gain when the losers put up a staunch defense. Then Bill Rosa signalled for a place kick. Aarona, who had been doing most of the kicking, was called upon to set the ball and Rosa booted it over the cross bars, the kick coming from the walkiki corner of the field, thus making it a pretty performance.

In the early stages of the game the winners attempted 10 field goals from 20 and 40 yards. "Piper" Rodrigues, considered one of the best drop kickers of Hawaii, disappointed his admirers when he failed thrice to boot the ball over the bar. His first trial was made from an angle on the 40 yard line, the second from the 30 yard mark and the third from the 33 yard line. Buck Aarona also missed three chances out of four kicks. And Elisha Andrews shared in with two unsuccessful kicks from placement.

Stars

On the Town Team Buck Aarona, Crabbe, Thurston, Bill Rosa and Herman Clark played a great game both on the defense and offense. The playing of Aarona was the best, he being used more than any other player. Herman Clark's tackling was good. The Outrigger team displayed two good men in Joe Stickney and Canario. The former was responsible for three first downs when he pierced the Town line in the fighting moments of the game. Canario ran the team with lots of varied plays, although his men failed particularly in accepting his beautiful forward passes. Bill Thompson at tackle was holding the line well while Anderson came through with some good guarding.
