

# 'Y' SWIMFEST MAY BE PUT FORWARD TO INCLUDE ROSS

Star's Ship Due To Leave For  
Australia Before End  
of Meet

DUKE AND LANGER  
WANTED AS ENTRANTS

**D**UE to the fact that the liner Niagara, on which Norman Ross is booked to depart for Australia, is due in Honolulu on the morning of December 5 and probably will sail that evening, it is probable that the "Y" indoor swimming meet, scheduled to take place on the nights of December 4 and 5, will be advanced to the 3rd and 4th instead. The swimming committee has not made up its collective mind but will do in a day or two.

The loss of Ross as an entrant would detract greatly from the drawing power of the meet upon the receipts of which the committee is depending to allay the deficit of the recent fall swimming meet held in the harbor.

There is a possibility that Duke Kahanamoku and Ludy Langer may be induced to appear in exhibition. As Langer is to be the official starter, it probably would be out of the question for him to enter in competition, even if he is in shape to do so.

Word has been received by the swimming committee that Helen Martin, formerly an Outrigger club swimmer, is due in Honolulu on the Lurline next Wednesday. It is not known whether or not she will make a post entry but her friends would not be surprised to see her enter the meet despite the lack of time for training. Miss Martin now is rated as a San Francisco swimmer and holds the Pacific Coast record for breast stroke for women.

Entries will be closed Tuesday.
