

# GIRLS' SWIMMING MEET LIKELY FOR FEBRUARY

Mrs. E. Fullard-Leo Placing Matter Before Women's Auxiliary of Outrigger Canoe Club Today — Would Be Preliminary Canter to Big April Carnival

As a preliminary to the big April meet, when mainland stars will compete against local talent in a number of national championship events, Mrs. E. Fullard-Leo proposes that a girls' swimming meet be held next month. She will place the idea before the women's auxiliary of the Outrigger Canoe club this afternoon.

The manner in which Mrs. Fullard-Leo will place the idea before the meeting of the Women's auxiliary this afternoon, will be in the form of a suggestion that the organization ask the A. A. U. to sanction a girls' meet to be held early in February in the Y. M. C. A. tank, providing the latter is available.

#### Prepare

The meet thus sanctioned by the A. A. U. would permit all records made to stand. It would be a one-night meet

and would give the local girls a chance to get in training for the big April meet which is coming.

Sanctioned by the A. A. U., the meet would be open to only those clubs which are members of the A. A. U. It is expected that by that time the Hui Makani will have been admitted to the A. A. U. which will mean that besides the Outrigger and Palama clubs, the Chilton organization will also take part in the meet.

#### Meeting

There is to be a meeting of the Hawaiian branch of the A. A. U. on January 12 at the Pan-Pacific building and in the event of the Women's auxiliary requesting it, there should be no difficulty in the sanction being granted at that time.

In the event that the woman's auxiliary does not take up the matter, the subject will be brought up from another angle and a general committee of the clubs formed and a request for sanction for such a meet made by the committee.
