SWIMMING ALTERNATES WITH THE BOAT RACING

Following a hard luck start in the women's open 100 yard swimming event, Kuualoha Keliipio, Hilo's mermaid, came back with a bang at Kuhio wharf this morning by taking the 220 yard open from a mixed field of girls and boys. This race which was perhaps the most interesting of the wole swimming program was won after a hard fight in 3:20 flat. Among the other entries were Gay Harris of the Honolulu Outrigger Club, J. Kaheleanu of the Hui Makena of Honolulu and two of the four Honolulu mermaids.

At the first call for the swimming races, Isabella Keliipio was the only entrant to respond for the junior girl's 25 yard event. There being no other contestant, Isabella swam alone, swimming against time, and taking the medal provided for this race, in 16 1-5 seconds.

The 100-yard women's open, second on the program, was one of the most interesting events on the schedule, in that in this race the two Misses Kenn, Agnes and Elsie Auld and Kuualoha Keliipio were entered. Kuualoha Keliipio was seized with a cramp at the start, but recovered sufficiently to come in third in a hard fought finish. Agnes Auld of Honolulu won first place, her sister look second, with Kuualoha Kelilio in third place.

A third race, that for boys under 12, was the final called in the intermission between the Senior and Junior six-oared barge races. Although four boys were entered, only three responded. K. Yasuda won, with Sonny McNicoll a close second.

Between the Junior Six-oared barge, and the Senior Scull the girls novice was called and won handily by Katherine McNicoll. This race was followed by the 100 yards men's open. Gay Harris captured first place in 1:03 1-5 second, and Sam Waina third.

Closing the swimming events Sam Waipa carried off the honors in the 50 yard novice with Kawasaki in second place, and Kamai nosing in as the final place maker.
