

Pearl Harbor to Enter Football Team in League

The Pearl Harbor Station will enter a football team this fall in the city league which will make a total of eight teams to struggle for the honor of meeting the University of Nevada. The other service teams which are expected to play are Luke Field, Fort Shafter and Schofield. The Waikikis, Palamas, University of Hawaii and Outriggers will be the civilian clubs in the race.

At a meeting of the Pearl Harbor Athletic council held last Monday it was definitely decided that the Navy would enter a team, and the preliminary work is scheduled to commence about the first of next month. The navy will probably enter as a single club the whole station, air service and all, combining to make a team.

The sailors will have three experienced men to take charge of the coaching side of the proposition, these being Ensign Billings of the Air Service, Captain Best of the Marine Corps and Lieutenant Kennedy of the Subbase. Billings is an all-around athlete who performs equally well in baseball and football, and those who have seen his work on the diamond can feel sure that the coaching is in competent hands. The other two are equally experienced, and the sailors should be able to turn out a snappy team with their aid.

A meeting will be held soon to make the final arrangements for the beginning of training. A captain has not yet been selected, and no one has signed up yet, so it is hard to tell just what the team will be like. The navy boys have some veteran material, however, and expect to make a good showing.
