

MANY IMPROVEMENT CLUBS ON RECORD IN FAVOR OF BOND ISSUE

Unanimous indorsement of the proposed bond issue of \$500,000 for sewers and sewer extensions at Kalihi and Waikiki has been given by a number of Honolulu civic and other organizations, according to letters received by Dan E. Mooney, chairman of the executive committee of the chamber of commerce which is arousing interest in the subject among the electorate.

Herbert D. L. Perry, writing on behalf of the Beach Walk Improvement club, states that organization is "behind the movement to a man," and that "everyone is taking it upon himself to promote the bond issue at every opportunity. "I am sure," Mr. Perry writes, "that if every organization of the city is behind this issue with the same enthusiasm, it will go through with a bang."

The Manoa Improvement club has also indorsed the project.

Charles G. Heiser, Jr., has been appointed a member of the executive committee to represent the Commercial club. At a recent meeting of the governors of the club the Waikiki-Kalihi sewer project was discussed and unanimously indorsed, and the club will cooperate with the executive committee in every way possible.

R. S. Kelly, secretary of the Kapahulu Improvement club, has informed Chairman Mooney that at a recent meeting that organization unanimously indorsed the sewer bond issue. The members expressed the hope that the bonds would "carry big" at the general election November 2.

The Outrigger Canoe club also heartily indorsed the issue, says Pres. Warren Dease in a letter to Chairman Mooney. "I personally feel," he adds, "that it is rather a shame that this question should have been neglected for so long, and the change cannot come too quickly."

The Rotary club has indorsed the project unanimously, and has urged all citizens to support the issue at the forthcoming election. The Hawaiian Engineering association has also given its unanimous indorsement.
