

PUNAHOU STAR IS SHOWING WELL ON CORNELL CINDERS

Crozier Finishes Second In Quarter-Mile, Beating His Island Mark Two Seconds

George "Jinky" Crozier, who entered Cornell University from Punahou this year, has already showed his mettle in track events.

Crozier won the 440 and 880 in the interscholastic Island meet and broke the interscholastic record in the latter last year.

In the first trials of the year at Cornell in the quarter mile, he ran a fast heat in the finals, finishing second to McDermott, the Cornell 'varsity quarter-miler and one of the best in college athletics.

"Jinky's" time has always been good, but this was the fastest he has ever negotiated the distance in. He made it in 51 seconds flat. His fastest time made here was 53 seconds flat.

If Crozier keeps on going the way he has started he will bid with the best in the land for premier honors. Cornell has one of the best track coaches in America in Moakley, and Honolulu athletes believe that under his tutelage the Punahou boy will break more records before he finishes college.

Crozier was captain of the Punahou championship team last year and was a heavy point winner. He also ran on the Outrigger track team and won. He is one of Hawaii's best track men and all his friends are proud to see that he promises to bring new athletic honors to the Islands.
