

Navy Favored To Defeat Varsity In Saturday Go

Next Saturday afternoon the University of Hawaii will open the heaviest football schedule it has ever played by meeting the Pearl Harbor eleven on Cooke field. It is the opinion of critics that the game will be very close, with the advantage slightly in favor of the sailors, due to the fact that the Varsity squad has been slow in getting under way, and that the sailors have already had the benefit of two early season scrimmages, one with Palama and one with the Outriggers.

The University schedule calls for nine games, with a tenth depending upon the outcome of the local season, as the second Nevada game will be played by the champions of the four team league. From Saturday until Christmas Eliot's men will not have an open date.

The first four games, which are all against service teams, will be played on Cooke field at the University; the game with Palama, the Outriggers and the Waikikis will be staged at Moilili; and both of the Nevada games at Alexander field, Punahou.

The University schedule for the season is as follows: Nov. 6, Pearl Harbor; November 13, Luke field; Nov. 20, Fort Shafter; Nov. 27, Schofield Barracks; Dec. 4, Palama Settlement; Dec. 11, Outrigger Canoe Club; Dec. 18, Waikiki Athletic club; Dec. 25, University of Nevada.
