Neither quarterback showed any inclination to uncork anything but straight old Siwash football, with an occasional pass thrown in when the opposing backs played too close to the line to make bucking feasible. The Manoaites punted often on third down and frequently even on second, preferring to let the Beach-combers do most of the attacking.

The next tally was registered in the same period when Fuller intercepted a forward pass and ran 70 yards for a touch-down. The last touchdown was chalked up by Parker on an off tackle buck in the second quarter after the Cancemen had recovered a fumbled punt on the varsity 15 yard line.
