

# Varsity Eleven Decides to Put In Hard Scrims

A program of heavy scrimmages was determined upon by the University of Hawaii football squad yesterday noon during the course of a get-together meeting presided over by Captain Norman King. It seemed to be the sentiment of the players that what they need is hard work and lots of it, if they want to make a decent showing against the club teams of Honolulu, and later the University of Nevada on Christmas day.

## Meet Wacs

Accordingly Manager Earl McTaggart was instructed to get in touch with the management of the Waikiki team, who had already asked for a practise scrimmage at an early date, and sign them up for Wednesday afternoon of this week. Later in the day McTaggart announced that the Gilman-Schumanites are available, and so the two elevens will meet tomorrow afternoon at 4:30 on Cooke field.

The effects of the trouncing which the Varsity received last Friday at the hands of the Outriggers in their first unofficial scrimmage, were on the whole beneficial. It brought the men to a full appreciation of their shortcomings, and made them realize that it is a different proposition to run up a score on a half drilled service eleven, and to make headway against a seasoned machine like Withington's beach-combers.

## Service Game

Next Saturday the university will play its last service game against the Schofield barracks eleven. The Schofield soldiers are known to be the strongest of the service aggregations, having piled up 34 points against Luke field last Saturday. Those who remember the close four-point margin by which the Collegians defeated them last fall will be on hand Saturday expecting to see a contest of the first order.

The Saturday following the Schofield game, the university and Palama elevens will usher in the official club season on December 4th at Moiliili field. This will be the first game in the contest for the supreme football honors of Hawaii, and also for the right to meet the University of Nevada at Alexander field in their second game on New Year's Day, the first game with the Nevadans being scheduled with the University of Hawaii as an intercollegiate engagement on Christmas Day, regardless of the standing of the Manoa team in the local club league.
