

GALAXY OF STARS FOR BIG MEET

FIVE TO COME DOWN IN FEBRUARY

Five mainland aquatic stars will be brought to Honolulu for the big swimming meet to be staged by the Hawaiian A. A. U. in the month of February next year as part of the carnival.

The board of managers of the Hawaiian A. A. U. at a meeting held last night decided to stage the 100 yard men's junior national championship, the 100 yard women's national championship and the men's junior national high dive, during the February meet.

To take part in these events Ethelda Bleibtrey, world champion woman swimmer of New York, will be brought here as well as Margaret Woodbridge of Detroit, who was a close second to the Gotham girl in the Olympic events in Antwerp. "Happy" Kuehn of Portland, Ore., champion springboard diver of the world, will be brought here for the diving as well as Haig

Priest of Los Angeles. The latter is not only a fancy diver but is a comedian as well.

To race Warren Kealoha in the backstroke, Ray Keagris of Los Angeles will be invited. Keagris defeated Kealoha in the mainland tryout prior to the Olympic games but lost out in Antwerp.

Indoor Meet

The indoor tank meet scheduled this month by the Hawaiian A. A. U. will be staged on the nights of December 15 and 16 at the Y. M. C. A. tank. There will be a meeting of the board on Tuesday noon in the Central "Y" to decide on the program and other details.

This meet will be the first time that Honoluluans will see the Hawaiian swimmers in action since last April. The three island swimmers who go to Australia, Duke Kahanamoku, Ludy Langer and Pua Kealoha, are scheduled to leave here on December 17.
