A. A. U. Meet At Y. M. C. A. To Have Entire Olympic Team

Entries for the benefit swimming meet to be given at the Y. M. C. A. December 17-18 by the Hawaiian Amateur Athletie Union, will close next Tuesday, and there are still some good swimmers whose names are wanted on the lists.

The meet will be the first opportunity Honolulu has had to see her swimmers work since they went to the mainland for the Olympic trials, and it is expected that every seat surrounding the Y tank will be filled each night.

The entire Olympic team will appear, and the program each night is one which will give all varieties of tal-

one of the features of the bill each night will be the "pake relay," the comedy race in which Duke Kahanamoku and several others caused the folks to laugh clear across the continent, and also in exhibitions in Europe.

Duke, Pua Kealoha and Ludy Langer will leave for Australia about Decem-ber 22, to be gone until spring on an exhibition tour, so the meet Friday and Saturday nights of next week will be, the only chance their fellow townsmen will have of seeing these world-famous stars in action for several months. The programs will be as follows:

Friday, December 17—Fifty yards for men, 220 yards for men, 160 yards men's backstroke, springboard diving, "pake" relay, 100 yards women's, 50 yards men's breaststroke, men's relay, women's breaststroke, 100 yards men's breaststroke, 50 yards for boys ander 15 years and 100 yards for boys under 15 years, and 100 yards service.

Saturday, December 18-One hundred yards men's, 440 yards men's, 50 yards men's backstroke, exhibition high div-ing, "pake" relay, 50 yards women's, 50 yards women's backstroke, women's relay, 100 yards men's for other than Olympic team members, men's plunge for distance, 20 vards for girls under 13 years, and 220 yards service.
