

Campbell's Drop-kick Wins For Outrigger In Splendid Exhibition With University

Quarterback, Kicking Against Wind, Registers Field Goal From 40-Yard Line, Game Ending With 3-0 Score

DROP-KICKING against the wind from the Hawaii 40-yard line midway during the second quarter, Campbell, Outrigger quarterback, won the game for his eleven over the University of Hawaii yesterday afternoon on the Moiliili gridiron. Final score: Outrigger 3, Hawaii 0.

Weather conditions considered, Campbell's drop-kick was a phenomenal one, for there was a stiff breeze blowing. Campbell's toe directed the ball unerringly, the oval clearing the horizontal bar by a bare foot. In fact, so close was the margin of safety that many in the audience were of the impression that the ball had gone under the bar.

It was anybody's game right up to the last moment of play. Even with the breaks favoring them, the Outriggers nosed the Varsity team out by the "skin of their teeth," as the saying goes, and while they are undoubtedly entitled to the victory the canoe paddlers can hardly be recalled upon to boast overmuch in regard to their prowess.

Barring one incident, when an Outrigger player sprang the rough stuff and gave a Varsity youngster a deliberately mean tumble, an affair for which he should have been put out of the game, the contest was a good one, filled with thrill after thrill. The gripping moment of the contest came just seconds before the end when Spencer missed a forward pass by a matter of inches. Had the pass been completed nothing would have been able to prevent a touchdown for Manoa, for Spencer had a clear field and but 25 yards to go.

Touchdown Raises Dispute

Previously to this Hawaii just barely missed making a touchdown. This was when Hawaii punted and the ball got away from the Outrigger. To many it appeared as if Hart touched the oval before it went over the Outrigger goal line. Thompson dropped on the ball beyond the line, and Hawaii claimed a touchdown. The officials decided it was a touchback.

The play was viewed by the fans, naturally, according to their sympathies, but the fans were not officiating, and the decision of the referee, who was on the job and looking for just such a play, was undoubtedly correct.

Joe Stiekney and Slade pulled off the spectacular runs for the winners, both being credited with two several brilliant runs for good gains. Hart was the plunger, and when the canoe-paddlers needed to put the ball over for downs the task usually fell to Jimmy Campbell did the punting in the first half for the winners and Andrews during the second half, and both used the boot well and frequently.

Conant, Searle and Lambert were the ground-gainers for the Varsity eleven, and Spencer also came in for some gains. On several occasions Hawaii was in striking distance of a drop-kick, but lack of a sure man in this department of the game forced them on one occasion to resort to a place kick, which did not work. Lydgate's punting seems to be still improving, and he certainly fields a whopper of a boot and toe.

The officiating was excellent, and those who might think they have a kick on this score have another think coming to them. The attendance was fair.

The Game In Detail

The battle opened with Captain King kicking off for Hawaii, Campbell returning the ball 10 yards. On first down Stiekney made no gain but on the next down he plowed through for 2 yards. B. Hollinger made a foot on third down. Campbell punts, Conant makes free catch. Searle advances the ball several inches and Lydgate punts ball to Outrigger 25-yard line.

Joe Stiekney electrified the crowd when he got away for a 35-yard run around left end. On two plays Hollinger gained 3 yards and Stiekney added two more on a long run around right end. Campbell punts. Conant and Searle made each a yard. Lydgate punted and Hawaii recovered ball on fumble on Outrigger 40-yard line. Conant lost a yard. Forward pass, Lambert to Conant, fails to work. Lydgate punts to Outrigger 11-yard line. Hart makes no gain and Campbell punts, Spencer fumbling and Campbell recovering on Hawaii 21-yard line. Hawaii penalized 5 yards. Outrigger fumbled, recovery by Hawaii.

Searle bored through center for 3 yards and again for 2, Lydgate punting. Campbell received and made a yard. Stiekney, again at it, made 8 yards around right end and Campbell carried the oval for downs. Campbell made no gain and Stiekney added 8 yards more to his credit around left end. Hart added yard and a half and on the next play put the pigskin over for downs.

On a fake drop-kick Campbell was thrown for a loss of 10 yards on a tackle by McConnell. Stiekney made no gain. Tarleton went in for Kanahole for Hawaii. Campbell forward-passed, the ball being successfully intercepted on Hawaii 18-yard line by Conant. Quarter whistle. No score.

Lambert and Searle made 2 yards each. Lydgate punted, Campbell being tackled on Outrigger 11-yard line by Tarleton. Again Stiekney stuck to it and pulled off the longest run of the day, for 35 yards. He added a yard on first down. Hart gains 4, but Stiekney loses a yard. Campbell punts to Hawaii 25-yard line. On first down there was a bit of rough play after the whistle blew, an Outrigger man lifting one of the Hawaii youngsters a shoulder-high and dropping him cold. Hawaii ball and Searle goes through for 10 yards. Lambert no gain. Conant makes downs. Hawaii fumbled and Withington recovers ball.

Stiekney goes through for three and Hart for eight yards and downs. No gain on next two attempts and Stiekney's forward pass fails to work. Campbell drew back and drop-kicked against the wind from Hawaii's 40-yard line, the ball clearing the horizontal by a bare foot. Score: Outrigger 3, Hawaii 0.

Conant Runs Well

Withington kicks for Outrigger, Conant running the back 30 yards. Lambert had a run of his own for 12 yards. Forward pass, Lambert to Spencer, gains 15 yards. Spencer goes around left end for 5 yards. Another forward pass, Lambert to Conant, adds 5 yards more to the Manoans. Spencer advances a foot through center and Searle goes through for downs. Spencer adds 3 yards. Forward pass, Lambert-Conant, gives Hawaii 8 yards more, but another, same shooter and receiver, loses 5 yards for the Manoans eleven. Hawaii tries place-kick from Outrigger 40-yard line, the oval falling short.

Outrigger ball on their 20-yard line. Stiekney gains yard, but Campbell makes no advance. Bill Hollinger bores through center for 4 yards. Campbell punts to Hawaii 45-yard line. Whistle blows half time, no change in score.

Third quarter opened with Withington kicking off for Outrigger and Conant running ball back 20 yards to Hawaii 50-yard line. Lambert goes 8 yards, Conant one and Lambert puts oval over for downs. On two bucks Lambert made as many yards. Lambert's forward pass fails. Lydgate punts to Outrigger 20-yard line. Anderson replaced by Kaupiko, and Slades and Elisha Andrews go in for Outrigger. Andrews makes 6 yards on two runs and Hart makes downs.

Andrews Gains Inches

Andrews gains a couple of inches and Hart makes 6 yards on two plunges. Andrews punts to Spencer, who runs the ball back 2 yards. Conant makes 10 gain and Searle earns a yard. Lydgate punting to Andrews, who was tackled on the spot by Tarleton. Hart goes ahead 3 yards and Andrews back one. Andrews punts, Hawaii fumble and Outriggers recover. On four bucks Hart carried the ball within half a foot of making downs, losing the oval to Hawaii.

Lambert makes a foot, Spencer 3 yards, Lambert earns nothing and Lydgate punts, Hawaii being given the ball on first down when Outrigger is penalized for tripping. Forward pass fails. Conant thrown for 13-yard loss. Lydgate punts and Andrews, who received, was tackled by Lambert on Outrigger 25-yard line. Andrews makes 2 yards, Slade 3 and 4 and Hart makes downs. Change in for Thompson and Thompson for Lambert, for Hawaii. Hart fumbles, recovers and gains yard and follows this with a four-yard gain as whistle closes third quarter with the ball on Outrigger 40-yard line on second down.

Final Quarter: Lively

Opening final quarter, Andrews punts to Thompson. Searle makes 12 yards on first down. Conant goes around right end for three yards. Forward pass fails and Spencer tackled by Hirth for 5-yard loss. Lydgate punts to Campbell on Outrigger 30-yard line, the ball being advanced 5 yards. Hart and Andrews make three yards each and Andrews punts to Hawaii 40-yard line.

Thompson carried the ball five yards and Conant made 15 yards. Spencer gained seven and a half yards. Forward pass fails. Thompson makes five yards. Lydgate punts, the ball going over the Outrigger goal line. Arguimbau, Hawaii claiming Hart touched the ball before crossing line and before Thompson dropped on the oval for what looked like a touchdown. Claim disallowed and ball given to Outrigger on 20-yard line.

Slade Shows Speed

On first down Outrigger loses five yards, Andrews being forced to punt. Hawaii made downs on forward pass. Thompson to Lydgate. Slade intercepted the next forward pass and made 30 yards before being downed. This was one of the feature runs of the day. On two bucks Hart gained seven yards, but Slade was thrown for loss of 7 yards. Forward pass by Andrews fails on fourth down. Hawaii ball.

Conant gained two, but Thompson lost a yard. Searle went through for a gain of 11 yards. Hanohane goes in for McConnell for Hawaii. Conant recovers lost ground. Lydgate punts to Jones, who fumbles, King recovering the ball for Hawaii. Two forward passes by Kinney fail. Searle makes five yards, Hawaii losing the ball on fourth down on an unsuccessful forward pass. With a clear field ahead of him and only 25 yards to go, Spencer missed the ball by a matter of inches. Season Will Open January 8, With Schedule of 30 Games; Old-Timers Assist

Six teams will compose the Honolulu Soccer Association, organized at a meeting at the Commercial club last night.

The following were representatives of clubs, with the teams they entered: E. W. Thacker, Schofield Service club; William Bell, proxy for Alex Ross, National Guard; Thomas Muirhead, Rangers; Fred C. Bailey, Outrigger Canoe club; George Low, Healanai Yacht and Boat club, and G. E. Virgo, Palama Settlement.

A. C. Hickman and Jack Simpson, old-time soccer players, volunteered to coach the National Guard and Palama Settlement teams, respectively. Members of these teams are new to soccer, and the coaches will help them get on par with the most experienced organizations.

The representatives of the six teams agreed to play a two-round series comprising a schedule of 30 games all told. The schedule will be published soon. The season opens January 8.

A feature of the meeting was the readiness with which the elder teams agreed to stand drafts of players to strengthen the other teams, the drafts to be made by the executive committee of the association.
