

FIFTY-THREE SWIMMERS ENTERED

BIG CROWD EXPECTED FOR MEET

SPLASH TOMORROW AND SATURDAY

Fifty-three swimmers are entered for the December swimming meet to be staged tomorrow and Saturday night at the Y. M. C. A. tank when the Hawaiian Olympic swimming team will make its first appearance in action since its European trip.

The 53 individual entries represent nine organizations. The Outrigger leads with 23 entries. The Hui Nalu have seven, Palama has five and Healani four. The Hui Makani is also entering four. Pearl Harbor Athletic club will have three, Luke Field Athletic club three, Fort De Russy two, 17th Cavalry one, and there will be one unattached swimmer.

There will be three teams entered for the men's relay and a similar number for the girls' relay. Hui Nalu, Outrigger and Healani will swim in the men's relay.

The biggest attraction of the meet will be Duke P. Kahanamoku, world champion sprint swimmer. During his tour abroad, Duke hit up a pace that indicates he is swim-

ming his best. He made the 100 meters in world record time in San Francisco last June in an official meet. In Paris he bettered his Neptune Beach time, but it was not an official meet. Local fans will get their chance to size up the star again.

Tickets for the meet have been selling fast and a record crowd is expected to be on hand for the affair. The "Pake" relay feature is another drawing card. This stunt has amused thousands on the mainland, but will be performed here for the first time Friday night.

Program

The program for tomorrow night is as follows:

Friday—220 yards men's; 100 yards service, 50 yards women's breaststroke; 50 yards, boys under 15 years; 100 yards men's breaststroke; 100 yards women's open; 50 yards men's; springboard diving; women's plunge for distance; 100 yards men's backstroke; men's relay of 60 yards, four men, and "Pake" relay.
