

RELAY RACES WILL FEATURE SWIMMING PROGRAM IN WHICH STARS WILL SHINE

**Tonight and Tomorrow Night
Sees Olympic Team Perform-
ing At Y. M. C. A. Tank**

ONE of the big features of the Hawaiian Amateur Athletic Union's special swimming meet at the Y. M. C. A. tonight and Saturday night will be the relay races—the men's relay tonight and the women's tomorrow night.

Relay races are the particular delight of local water-bugs, and the attention that has been given to this form of aquatics bore fruit in a victory for the American team in the relay racing at Antwerp.

Spectators at the Y. M. C. A. tank tonight and Saturday night will see the entire Hawaiian Olympic team in action — a few hundred people will watch the best efforts of the world's greatest swimmers in a card which would draw many thousands in New York, Chicago or any mainland city.

Women Stars To Swim

In the relay race for women one of the headliners will be Josephine Hopkins, who in the absence of "Dad" Center officiated as coach in swimming at the Outrigger Club.

Another star who has not been seen in action for some time is Ruth Scudder, who recently defeated Frances Crowels in two breast-stroke events in San Francisco. She is now recovered from a recent illness that put her out of the game for a while and is to stage her comeback at this December meet.

As the accommodations at the Y. M. C. A. tank are limited, the public is now taking advantage of the "early-shopping" theory, and grabbing off the tickets as fast as possible.

With the fact that a swimming meet has not been staged here in many moons—and the additional attraction of the participation of the Olympic team that took all swimming honors for Hawaii and America—there will be a reversal of the usual law of supply and demand. In other words there will be more demand for seats than there will be supply.
