

Kealoha Sets New Record In 100 Yard Back Stroke; 1.6 2-5

Olympic Star Smashes Record
Set By Himself In Detroit;
Four Local Times Lowered

One world's record and four local tank records were lowered last night at the benefit meet held at the Y. M. C. A. tank for the Hawaiian swimming team that is to visit Australia.

Warren Kealoha smashed the world record in the 100-yard backstroke event when he swam the distance in 1:06 $\frac{2}{5}$, cutting down the record he previously set in Detroit of 1:07 $\frac{4}{5}$. Kealoha, swimming for the Hui Makani Club came in a winner by 12 yards over Harris of the Outrigger Club.

Others Broken

Miss M. Wehslau of the Outrigger Club easily outdistanced Helen Moses of Hilo in the 100-yard open competition for women and broke her own tank record by two and two-fifth seconds. She made the distance in 1:09 $\frac{2}{5}$.

Sam Kahanamoku of the Hui Makani Club walked away from George Kane in the 100-yard breaststroke event for men. Kahanamoku smashed the local tank record by two and four-fifth seconds. The time was 1:17.

George Kane of the Healan Club crossed the tank first in the 100-yard race for service men. He won by ten yards over Kamana of Pearl Harbor. He smashed the record for the Island by two and one-fifth seconds when he came in in 1:03 $\frac{2}{5}$.

Duke Kahanamoku swam true to form when he lowered the Island tank record in the 50-yard open contest for men by one second. He came in two yards ahead of Pua Kealoha of the Hui Makani. Time was :24 $\frac{2}{5}$.

The Outrigger Club won the relay race for men in 2:04 $\frac{2}{5}$. Hui Nalu was second, with Healan third.
