

# Harris Comes In Winner From Duke In 100 Yard Swim Event

## Narrow Margin Loses Race For Champion—Two Island Records Smashed On Second Night of Swimming Carnival

Racing stroke for stroke with the world's champion sprint swimmer, W. W. Harris last night won apparently by the length of his hand from Duke Kahanamoku in the 100 yard men's event that opened the last night of the benefit meet at the Y. M. C. A. tank and equalled the tank record set by Duke himself of 55.4-5 seconds.

In addition to this, the most stirring of all the events on the card, two island records were broken. Marie Wehslau, swimming for the Outrigger Club smashed the record of :31 2-5 set by herself for the 50 yard free style for women and put across a splendid race in :30 1-5 seconds. Ruth Scudder was a good second, while Helen Moses finished third.

Ruth Scudder lopped one and two-fifths seconds off the tank record for the fifty yard back stroke swim for women. The previous mark, set by Thelma Kenn was 40:4-5 seconds and Scudder swam the distance in 39:2-5 in a hotly contested race in which Marie Wehslau and Thelma Kenn finished second and third respectively.

One of the most spectacular events of the evening was the 440 for men in which Langer beat Warren Kealoha by approximately three yards. It was a close race for many laps with Langer gaining on the straight-away only to lose his advantage on the turns. Finally Langer forged ahead and in spite of a gritty spurt by Kealoha on the last lap tore through the water for an easy win.

The women's relay was won by the Outrigger Club team captained by Helen Moses. The feature of this race was the desperate sprint in the last relay by Marie Wehslau who all but nullified the advantage gained by Moses' team in the three previous sections of the race.

The pake relay was well received, and kept the spectators engrossed in the first rows despite the fact that water was splashed over many a holiday frock and palm beach suit.
