

Guard Team Looks Good In Practice For Nevada

Practice Shows Citizen Soldiers
As Worthy Opponents For
Sagebrush Quint

BASKETBALL LEAGUE TO HAVE TWELVE TEAMS

All teams that are entered in the Honolulu Basketball league were to have signified final intention last night. Latest reports as issued by Percy Nottage, president of the league, indicate that a 12 team schedule will be drawn up under the supervision of Major Lewis, department morale officer, who is also secretary of the league.

The National Guard team has lost none of its skill in basketball, according to reports that come from the headquarters of the quintet as an aftermath of the first practice held in preparation for the Nevada game.

The guardsmen are hitting their pace just as if they had been playing steadily from the time they took the 1919-20 championship in two leagues.

The Outriggers, who will play the second game with the Sagebrushers, are putting in heavy practice periods. Last night they staged a big rehearsal at the Y. M. C. A. and as a result have picked a strong team to contend with the visitors.

The two match game, January 3 and 4, will demonstrate the way the local headliners stack up against the winners of the title in the Pacific Coast basketball conference. The entire championship quintet from the University of Nevada will be on the job, and the five are reputed to be a most deadly combination of passers and basket tossers. The only team defeating them last season was the Los Angeles Blues, the winners of the National championship in the A. A. U.

Bleachers will be erected in the armory for the occasion, and the accommodations will provide seats for several thousand spectators.
