

Bathing Suits Will Be Brief Within Reason

Bathing suits that entrants will be required to wear at the second Hawaiian swimming meet for women, February 27, will be censored with sense, according to a member of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Outrigger club. The dressing room steward will not hold to the letter of the ruling that suits must be not lower than three inches below the base of the neck, nor lower than two inches under the armpit and have shoulder straps at least two inches wide, when in her opinion modesty does not require it. Parents have refused in the past to allow their daughters to enter a contest in which girls were immodestly attired, and, while the games committee means to carry out the wishes of parents, who would otherwise not permit their daughters to compete, it has no intention of barring out any contestant whose suit is not objectionable, says Mrs. F. F. Leo, chairman of the committee.
