The tentative plans are to have at least half a dozen canoes in the races, including private canoes owned by Center and Judge Harry Steiner. The races will be run with handicaps and suitable prizes will be put up. Center hopes to get a motor launch to carry the officials, newspapermen and moving picture cameras over the course during the races.
