

MARIECHEN SETS RECORD; DUKE IN FINALS

Kahanamoku Wins His
Semifinal But Weissmuller
Swims Faster In His

Arne Borg Second To Johnny
In Freestyle; Wehselau
Lowers Bleibtrey Mark

LES TOURNELLES,
July 19.—Duke Kahanamoku,
Hawaii, and Johnny
Weissmuller, Chicago, won
their semi-final heats today
in the preliminary trials for
the 100 meter (109.36
yards) free style Olympic
race today, with Sam Kaha-
namoku second to his
brother and Arne Borg,
Sweden, second to Weiss-
muller.

Duke Kahanamoku's time was 1
minute 11-5 seconds, while Weiss-
muller's time was 1 minute and 4-5
seconds.

The qualifiers for the 100 meter
women's freestyle included Marie-
chen Wehselau, Hawaii, whose time
was 1 minute 12 2-5 seconds. The
former Olympic record, 1:13:3-5,
was established by Ethelda Bleib-
trey, New York, in 1920. Miss Stan-
ner of Great Britain was second.

The qualifiers in the plain high
diving for women included Miss
Becker, Atlantic City; Miss Topel,
Sweden; Helen Meany, New York
women's swimming association.

Clarence Pinski, San Francisco;
A. L. White, Stanford university,
and Dave Fall, Stanford, were first
in their respective preliminaries for
the men's plain high diving. Three
athletes from Sweden finished sec-
ond in the preliminaries.
