

Paris, July 19.—Miss Wehselau of the United States swimming team broke the Olympic record for the 100 meters free style swimming race today in her heat of the Olympic trials. She swam the distance in 1:12 2-10.

The second heat of the women's event was won by Miss Ethe Lackie of the United States in 1:12 8-10. Miss Gertrude Ederle of the United States won the third heat in 1:12 6-10.

Johnny Weismuller and Duke Kahanamoku both qualified in the semi-final heat of the 100 meters free style event for men today.

The first heat: Duke Kahana-moku, 1:01 8-10; Sam Kahanamoku, 1:02 2-10; Takaishi, Japan, 1:03 5-10.

Second heat — Weismuller, 1:00 8-10; Arne Borg, 1:02 6-10; Henry Australia, 1:3.

The results of the Olympic high diving contests today: First heat—Pinkston, United States, 6 points; Adlez, Sweden, 11 points. Second heat—White, United States, 5 points; Oberg, Sweden, 10 points. Third heat—Fall, United States, 7 points; Elquist, Sweden, 7 points.

In the 100 meters back stroke for women Miss Bauer won the first heat in 1 minute and 24 seconds. This broke the world's record in the event.

Miss Harding, United States, finished second in the first heat in 1 minute and 29 3-5 seconds, and Miss Riggin won the second heat in 1 minute and 29 3-5 seconds. Miss Harding and Miss Riggin also swam the distance in better time than the old world's record.
