Record Entries on the Card For Tonight in Women's Aquatic Meet

Seven Championships at Stake When the Gun Starts Opening Event at Punahou Tank; Service Stars Enter

HE biggest entry list in the history of the annual women's swimming meets staged under the auspices of the Women's auxiliary of the Outrigger Canoe club, will appear tonight at Punahou tank in the 1924 competitions. Seven Hawaiian championships will be awarded, three for men and four for women swimmers, and in addition the Swanzy and other trophies are to be up for competition.

Leading women stars are to compete, among the number being Mariechen Wehselau, Olympic games star. The events are pared down to a number of entries which assures keen competition. No heats will be required in the championships, as all such have been swum ahead of time in order that tonight's program may be run off as rapidly as is possible.

The Punahou tank, one of the world's finest swimming pools, offers ideal seating arrangements that provide a maxi-

mum of confort, and every part of each lane in the pool is in plain view of each member of the audience at all times.

Grammar school swimmers to Olympic stars will be included on the program, which is one of the most comprehensive ever presented here.

Heats in the 100-yard event were held last night and some of the competitors in other events staged their final workouts.

The Marines have a strong competitor, coached by Cpl. W. C. Welsh, in the 100 yards freestyle. This entry is King, star sprinter of the water wizards from the Marine barracks. Lieut. L. R. Stickles, boxing officer at the barracks, is displaying his versatility by entering in the plunge event. In the 200yard relay the Marine team com-posed of Wells, Grimme, King and Welsh is expected to cut quite a figure.

The army is entering two teams, one from sector and the other from Schofield. Service men are competing in the open as well as the interservice events.

The affair commences at 8:00 o'clock this evening. Today tickets are available at Dawkins Benky company, and this evening will be had at the gate. Parking accommodations have been arranged.
