

Mariechen Wehselau Is Three Times Winner In Swanzy Cup Competition

Sam Kahanamoku Sets New Record for 100-Yard Breaststroke; Big Entry for Sixth Annual Women's Meet

FOR the third time Mariechen Wehselau, world's champion woman swimmer, won the Swanzy cup, with a total of 21 points. Miss Wehselau won four firsts in the Swanzy competition and took a third in the diving. Her firsts came in the 100-yard freestyle, 50-yard breaststroke, 50-yard backstroke and plunge. Miss Shepherd received the first place medal in this latter event, but she was not entered in the Swanzy competition.

Miss Pauline Laird was second in the competition with nine points, Dot Waters third with eight and Leilehua Judd fourth with seven.

Only one record was broken during the evening, most of the times being slow. Sam Kahanamoku swam to a new record in the 100-yard breaststroke, making it in 1:16 4-5. The old record was 1:17 1-5.

Sam Kahanamoku starred in the men's events, winning two firsts and a second, for 13 points. He swam a beautiful lap in the relay, but Pratt's lead was too great and he failed to gain back the lost water.

Carolyn Shephard sprung a surprise in the women's plunge when she floated to a victory over Mariechen Wehselau. Helen Moses' record was not endangered but Miss Shephard looks like a comer in this event.

Gay Harris had things his own way in the backstroke open. Sam Kahanamoku took second but at no time was Harris in danger. Harris has improved his form since going on the Olympic trip and looks better all-around in his event.

Helen Bartell turned in a pretty win in the opening event for the 50 yards novice Elanore Bickerton, favored to win, was a close second.

The men's plunge brought out a coming star in Lieut. Stickle of the U. S. Marine Corps. The husky plunger from Marine Barracks was far ahead of Bush who took second in this event. The time, :56 was not exceptional but with training Stickle should lower this a lot.

The service relay saw another Marine victory. The Marine team won easily over Honolulu and Schofield but the fight for second place was more interesting. Schofield took the lead over Honolulu from the gun, and it was not until the last few feet that Sector pushed out in front and out-touched Schofield. The service record was not broken by the winners.

Sam Kahanamoku had things his own way in the 100 open but the spectators were brought to their feet by the close finish of the next three men. John Wood, Y. Pratt, O. C. C., and Minneville put up a scrappy finish for the other two places. Wood out touched Pfatt who took the third place.

Pearl Buffum, Hui Makani, put up a pretty exhibition in the dives and took first place over Pauline Laird and Leilehua Judd, second and third. Miss Buffum scored perfect on her last two dives and averaged high on all of her others, bringing her total safely in front for a first place. The other divers all experienced one or more poor dives, especially from the high board, where the high wind seemed to affect their poise.

Marion Scott grammar school took first and second in the girls' race for grammar schools. Katherine Morrill and Dot Dufao were first and second with Sarah Paresa, from Central Grammar school third. Mor-
