

# BEACH CLUBS TO EXCHANGE SITES

An exchange of Waikiki beach property of the Queen Emma and B. P. Bishop estates is expected to bring about improvement and expansion of the Outrigger Canoe club and the Uluniu Women's Swimming club.

According to an agreement reached yesterday between all of the parties involved, the Uluniu and the Outrigger clubs will exchange their present locations.

Both clubs, however, will remain on property belonging to the same estates that they previously leased from.

Uluniu club will be under sub-lease for 25 years to the Royal Hawaiian hotel, which is in turn located on Bishop estate land. The club will occupy the site now occupied by the Outrigger club canoe sheds.

The Outrigger club will build a new main building, canoe sheds and beach patrol headquarters on the site of the present Uluniu club. The club's new lease with the Queen Emma estate will be made for 25 years.

Mrs. Arthur L. Andrews, president of Uluniu, said today that it has not been decided whether the club will construct a new building on the new site next to the Royal or will move the present structure. The Bishop estate has agreed to pay all moving expenses of the club, she said.

The Uluniu club yesterday re-elected Mrs. Andrews and named new officers. They are Mrs. Antonio Perry, first vice president; Mrs. E. C. Webster, second vice president; Mrs. W. J. MacNeil, treasurer, and Mrs. W. A. Wall, secretary. Directors are Susan Fountain, Mrs. Thayne N. Livesay, Mrs. W. H. Eller, Mrs. J. F. Morgan, Mrs. Frank Cunning, Mrs. David Fullaway and Mrs. L. W. Jongeneel.

Nominating the new Uluniu club officers were Mrs. Ernest Cameron and Mrs. Chester Livingston.
