

# Harborites Show Class To Triumph

## A. Braun Big Star; Out- rigger Six Downs University

**B**EHIND the beautiful slamming and blocking of A. Braun, the Pearl Harbor A. C. defeated the Vagabonds in the longest ASUH Senior Volleyball league game of the season in the University of Hawaii gym, the three set match requiring an hour and a half to finish. The scores: 12-15, 15-8, 16-14.

A stubborn University of Hawaii sextet forced the crack Outrigger Canoe club sextet to come from behind to emerge the winner in the second game of the night by the scores of 12-15, 15-11, 15-9.

So close was the action in the first game that the large crowd was kept on its feet most of the three sets as they witnessed the best game of the league to date.

### A BRAUN STARS

A. Braun's blocking was the feature attraction of the night. For the losers, E. Kraft, Combs and Aiu played exceptionally well.

In the first set the Pearl Harbor team led 4 to 0 but the Vagabonds rallied to win out. In the final set Pearl Harbor led, 9-3, only to have the Vagabonds pass them at 12-10. Pearl Harbor spurred to gain a 16-14 victory in the final set.

An upset appeared ready for the books when the Deans walked through the Waikiki team in the first set. However, the Outrigger aggregation's team play told in the second set as they won by a 15-11 score.

In the final set the University led, 8-3, but the Outrigger settled down to finish ahead of the collegians, 15-9.

Dolan and Parker were the main cogs in the Outrigger machine, while V. A. Choy and K. C. Chun stood out for Hawaii.
