

# Pearl Harbor Volley Team Downs Apollos As Matsons Beat Aiea In ASUH Loop

Shippers, Led By Keliikipi And Pedro, Trounce  
Sugarites, 15-2, 15-9—Remain Undefeated  
—Apollos Lose, 15-1, 15-10

THE Pearl Harbor Civilians conquered the Apollos, 15-1, 15-10 last night in the feature game of the ASUH Volleyball league in the University gymnasium. In the other game, the Matsons remained undefeated for the 1937 campaign when they took the measure of Aiea, 15-2, 15-9.

It was the seventh straight victory chalked up by the Matsons. With A. Braun and Bert Loughmiller slamming viciously, the Pearl Harbor Civilians made a walk away of the first set of their match with the Apollos who yielded after annexing only one point.
