

# Shippers Now Need Only One More Victory To Win ASUH Loop Championship

Pearl Harbor Team Conquered By Score Of 15-3, 15-12—Hansen, Keliikipi Are Stars—Vagabonds Beat Outrigger, 15-8, 15-10

CONTINUING to set a formidable pace which their rivals have not been able to match all season, the Matson A. C. aggregation, coached by Manuel Ferreira, last night defeated the powerful Pearl Harbor Civilian team, 15-3, 15-12 to annex their eighth successive victory.

As a result, they can suffer no worse a fate than a tie for the championship. They have two more games on their schedule and need to win only one of them to clinch the championship. In the other game, the Vagabonds downed Outrigger, 15-8, 15-10.

On Wednesday night the Matsons will play the Outrigger Canoe Club at 7:30 and the Pearl Harborites will meet the Vagabonds in the nightcap.

It was again the stellar offensive playing of Keliikipi and Hansen that paved the way for the Matson's victory. Their slamming was vicious and their adversaries could not handle them. The Shippers won the first set easily, but in the second set they met with stiffer competition. Playing like champions, they repulsed the Harborites' attack.

## SECOND SETBACK

The defeat was the second to be suffered by the Pearl Harbor team and both setbacks were met at the hands of the Matsons.

With Sonny Lee feeding Keliikipi and Hansen well for slams, the Matsons as already stated walked off with the first set after yielding only three points.

Early in the second set, the Matsons continued to make a walk-away of the match, but with the score standing 11-2, the Pearl Harborites staged a sensational rally and tied the score at 12-12. A. Braun scintillated in this comeback of the Harbor team.

Matson immediately took time out to figure a defense for their opponents' attack which suddenly became furious and almost irresistible.

As play was resumed, Hansen did some beautiful smashing to clinch the deciding points for the Shippers.

Outrigger played the Vagabonds last night without Beechert and Parker in their lineup, but they put up a whale of a battle and lost only after a bitter fight.

In the first set the clubmen led 5-1 but the Vagabonds staged a brilliant comeback to win at 15-8. Attempting to salvage the match, the Outriggers launched a strong offensive for a 10-7 lead, but their attack wilted thereafter.

Meanwhile the Vagabonds were clicking to better advantage and they finally emerged the winner of the set and match.
