IMEDIATELY after the final game Friday night, the officials of the ASUH Senior Volleyball league went into a huddle and after a brief session selected the above mythical all star teams.

Coach Mannie Ferreira's powerful Matson aggregation, undefeated champions and undoubtedly the strongest volleyball team yet to grace any court in Hawaii, placed three men and won top honors. Second came the Pearl Harbor team coached by A. L. Lambert with two men on the first team. The Vagabonds, runner-up with the Pearl Harbor A. C., placed one individual.

UNANIMOUS SELECTIONS

There were no arguments or dissensions concerning the choice of the three players forming the attack for the first team. Charles Keliikipi, Earl Kraft, and Albert Braun were unanimous choices. Keliikipi was without doubt the hardest hitter in the whole league. His pile driving slams made him a sure point winner once on the front line. A hard player and a hard hitter, he gave his best in every game. David Braun of the Pearl Harbor A. C. was not the hard hitter that Keliikipi was, but he wessly made up for this by his clever placing and slamming. The Vagabond's only contribution to the first team, Earl Kraft, was surely the most inspirational player on the court at any time. His unusual ability and knack of bringing "down" the ball from almost any angle made him the most valuable player for any team.

For the set-ups Captain Larry Akau and Sonny Lee of the Matsons were unanimous choices. Akau was a combination feeder and slammer while Sonny Lee's accurate feeding enabled Keliikipi to star. For the third player, it was a toss-up between J. Cahill and D. Braun, both of the Pearl Harbor team. The scale tipped to Cahill's favor because of his better blocking and more consistent feeding.

For the second team, there was no choice among the five slammers. George Hansen and Pedro Ancunzio played some great games, but the former was not consistent enough in all games to be placed in the first team, while Pedro, although a great offensive player, fell down on defense. Berdie Loughmiller was the other half of the Pearl Harbor offense and thus merited a place on the second team. Chiswick was the only slammer from the Outrigger Canoe club to place on the mythical teams. With proper feeding and more experience "Cheesle" should be a top notcher next year. Frank Combs of the Vagabonds played consistent ball throughout the season but he lacked the power that Keliikipi or Kraft had.

For set-up on the second team Kiakona of the O. C. C. gained the officials' nod over anyone else. David Braun was also a unanimous choice. Walter Nobriga of the Vagabonds, because of his good and timely blocking, was easily the third member of the set-up squad.

The 1937 A.S.U.H. Volleyball League had the most successful season ever staged in Honolulu. Credit goes to "Pump" Searle, genial graduate manager of the Associated Students of the University of Hawaii and manager of the league. Plans for next year have already been drawn and include a junior circuit as well as the senior.

The volleyball league this season was a financially successful one and will be concluded with the staging of the Inter-Island tournament on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of this week.
