

Ten Events To Be Held On Ala Wai

Races To Prepare Local
Crews For Kona
Regatta

3 CLUBS ENTERED

Members Of Hui To Of-
ficiate; Kahanamoku
Named Referee

THE Kamaaina Beachcombers' Hui, which, with the cooperation of the Associated Students of the University of Hawaii, successfully staged the recent Duke P. Kahanamoku Indoor swimming meet, will sponsor a canoe paddling regatta on June 11 on the Ala Wai Canal, Theodore Searle, president of the Hui, announced yesterday.

Organized some years ago to encourage and stress the development of aquatic sports in the Islands, the Hui is making every effort to bring swimming and canoe racing back to their original popularity and importance.

The regatta on Kamehameha Day will fire the opening gun, so to speak, in preparing the local crews for the annual Kona races which will be held August 21 at Kailua.

THREE CREWS ENTERED

In the June 11 meet, 10 races will be staged and at least three clubs will enter crews in the various events, they being Hui Nalu, Outrigger and Matson A.C. Training has already started on the Ala Wai and a week from Friday when the crews vie for honors, they will be in top physical condition. Duke Kahanamoku has been named referee of the regatta.

The placid waters of the canal is expected to help the crews to register fast times. There is no current to speak of, making the canal ideal for
