

Four Clubs To Send Crack Crews Into Regatta

THE Ala Wai Canal will present a busy scene today as the Outrigger Canoe Regatta, sponsored by the Kamaaina Beachcombers' Hui, gets underway at 2 p. m. With a program of 10 events booked for the day's entertainment, the waters of the canal are due to get the churning of the year as four clubs vie for honors in the paddle tournament.

Queen's Surf, Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Matson are the clubs entered in the regatta, with Hui Nalu expected to carry off a major portion of the victories. Two events are listed for women, six for men and two for boys. As an added attraction, the Honolulu girls and the Outrigger girls have been entered in the half-mile six-paddle canoe race.

3. 1 mile senior six-paddle canoe for men.
4. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile surfboard paddling for men.
5. 1 mile junior six-paddle canoe for men.
6. $\frac{1}{4}$ mile surfboard paddling for boys under 17.
7. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile six-paddle canoe for women.
8. $\frac{1}{4}$ mile six-paddle canoe for boys under 17.
9. 1 mile senior four-paddle canoe for men.
10. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile surfboard paddle relay for men.
