However, later in the day, Outrigger came back to win the senior four event in 8 minutes 31-5 seconds. A. E. Minville, Robert Dolan, Kirk Lyser, and Sally Hale comprised the crew that defeated the Hui Nalus.

Outrigger also triumphed in the Junior 4 event defeating Hui Nalu. In the winning boat were Sargent Kahanamoku, Mel Paoa, Fred Wilhelm, and Sam Kahanamoku. They cressed the finish line in the mile in 8 minutes 1 second.
