

# Hui Approves Invasion By Olympic Club

## Negotiations Opened For Swimmers To Perform Here In August

**M**EMBERS of the Kamaaina Beach-combers' Hui, at their annual meeting Sunday at the country home of Harold W. Castle, authorized its swimming committee to open immediate negotiations for a team of swimmers from the Olympic Club of San Francisco to come here for the big Duke P. Kahanamoku outdoor swimming meet to be held under the auspices of the Hui at the War Memorial natatorium in August.

Plans are to bring Coach George Schroth and eight members of the Bay City club here for a two-night meet. The visitors would arrive on Saturday, August 14, appear the nights of August 18th and 20th and leave on Saturday, August 21. The cream of the local aquatic world will be sent against the invading mer-men.

### PLAN RETURN TRIP

Through connections made with the Olympic Club during this year's invasion, the Hui hopes to arrange a trip to the Mainland for a team of outstanding local swimmers next summer, immediately after the annual Duke Kahanamoku indoor meet. The team would appear in eight or ten ports up and down the Pacific Coast.

Such a trip will be made only if time made by local swimmers assure the success of the invasion.

Over a hundred members of the Hui and invited guests attended the annual meeting Sunday. Various athletic events were held in the morning followed by a big luau. The program included the annual indoor baseball game between the Outrigger and Hui Nalu for the Dad Center trophy. Hui Nalu won after a bitter battle, 1 to 0.

The Hui also voted Sunday to sponsor another program of canoe and surfboard paddling races on the Ala Wai canal New Year's morning. A Hui luncheon will follow the races and then the members will attend the football game between the University of Hawaii and Stanford in a body.
