

OUTRIGGER CLUB TO BE REPAIRED

Repair of the Outrigger Canoe club pavilion or construction of a new building will be discussed at a meeting of directors of the club next Tuesday evening. Leslie Hicks, chairman of the building committee, announced today.

At the club headquarters, it was said the pavilion condemned by the city-county building department was not so badly undermined by termites.

An inspection disclosed a few beams were termite eaten, and when these are replaced by new ones, expected to take two weeks, the pavilion will be opened to the public again, it was said.

The club directors will study whether it will be advisable to repair the building extensively or erect a new modern structure.

The club's lease from the Queen Emma estate expired June 30, and whether a drive for funds will be made for a new building is expected to be decided at Wednesday's meeting.

Because the pavilion has been condemned, the McCully Japanese Athletic club is staging its bon dance at the Hawaiian Town tonight.
