

Outrigger Club Proposes \$50,000 New Building Plans

Plans for a \$50,000 building program for the Outrigger Canoe club at Waikiki, involving an enlarged beach frontage of 210 feet, were revealed yesterday by T. G. Singlehurst and Leslie A. Hicks, members of the board of directors of the famous Waikiki club.

Construction work on the new buildings will begin as soon as an exchange of property has been made through the land court between the Outrigger club and the Uluniu Women's club, which leases adjoining land on the beach, Hicks said.

According to the present lay of the property, the Outrigger Canoe club leases a dog leg shaped piece of land circling the Uluniu

club, and affords only a 48-foot frontage on the beach. As soon as the land has been transferred, the Uluniu club site will be transferred to property of the same area adjoining the Royal Hawaiian hotel.

"When the land is transferred, the Outrigger property will extend in a rectangular area from Kalakaua avenue to the beach, with a frontage of 210 feet," Hicks said. "We will then reorganize the entire club, tearing down the old pavilion, the present kitchen facilities and the canoe sheds."

According to tentative plans now being drawn up by Architect C. W. Dickey, a \$20,000 club house

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
