

Two More Women's Events Added to Kahanamoku Meet

TWO women's races have been added to the list of events for the Duke P. Kahanamoku Outdoor swimming meet, which will be held August 18 and 20 in the War Memorial natatorium, and in which the Olympic club swimmers of San Francisco will participate.

The events are 100 yards free-style open, which will be held on August 18, and the 100 yards breaststroke, which will be held on August 20.

A feature exhibition compet has also been added. It is the father and son relay in which members of the Hui Nalu and the Outrigger Canoe club will participate.

Also among the features will be a precision swim by youngsters who will be tutored by Duke Kahanamoku himself.

The Kamaaina Beachcombers' Hui, which is sponsoring the meet, plans to make it the biggest outdoor swim competition to be

held in Honolulu since the Yale-Meiji-Hawaii meet of 1932. Plans for it are progressing at a rapid clip. Pump Searle, president of the Hui, said yesterday that a meeting of the club will be held at C. Q. Yee Hop Friday evening at 6:30.

Eight of the best swimmers of the Olympic Club will be sent here for the meet. Under Coach George Schroth, swimming coach, eliminations will be held by the Winged-O club to determine the natators to be sent to the Islands.

Next year a group of mermen will be sent to the Mainland from Honolulu.
