

Hui Nalu To Send Strong Team To Kahanamoku Meet

THE SPIRIT of other years when the club used to send swimmers to the Olympic games exists these days around the Hui Nalu clubhouse where a strong band of swimmers are preparing for the Kahanamoku outdoor swimming meet at the War Memorial natatorium on Wednesday and Friday nights of this week.

Recruited with many new young members, Hui Nalu will send a husky team of swimmers and paddlers over to the natatorium under the direction of John de Kaupiko, Sr., who is coaching the boys.

John D. looks to these new members to cop honors in the relay races. In the 200-yard medley relay Hui Nalu will be represented by Dave Nottage, Jim Moody, Atherton Guard and Bill Purdy. The same quartet, with the exception of Nottage who will be replaced by Sam Kahanamoku, will swim the 400-yard relay for the Black and Gold.

PAOA ENTERS SPRINTS

Sam Kahanamoku will also wear the Black and Gold in the 50 and 100 yard freestyle events. Another Hui Nalu entrant in the sprints will be Melvin Paoa.

Wednesday night Hui Nalu's crack surfboard artists will meet a team of Outrigger Club paddlers in a surfboard polo match, the first game of its kind held in the Islands for sev-

eral years. On Friday night the Black and Gold poloists will meet the Olympic club team in a regulation match.

The Hui Nalu paddlers are also expected to swim off with honors in the 100 yard surfboard race and the surfboard relay.
