MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF

GROUNDS AT WAIKIKI, Thursday, Jan. 13, 1921.

President Dease called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M.. with the following directors present: messers. Dease, Bailey, Asch, Center, Graves, Deverill and Podmore. Mooney and Starratt were absent. Dr. Paul Withington was present by invitation.

MINUTES:

Upon motion of Mr. Center, seconded by Mr. Graves, the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting was waived.

PRESIDENT:

The President issued complimentary cards to the Nevada Football Team and to the officers of H.M.S. "Chatham".

TREASURER'S REPORT:

On motion of Mr. Graves, seconded by Mr. Asch, the Treasurer's Report was accepted and placed on file.



CAPTAIN:

The Captain reported that some of the canoes had been repaired and that he had purchased a small canoe with two sets of sails for \$60.00 from Mr. Harry Steiner. He also reported having purchased 6 volley balls at a cost of \$7.00 each.

The Captain spoke of the success of the Swimming teams and that the Girl's team now held every tank record in the islands.

HOUSE COMMITTEE:

Mr. Asch, in behalf of Mr. Starratt, reported that 81 new steel lockers had arrived and would be put in place, probably on Monday.

ORDER & ENTERTAINMENT COMMITTEE:

Mr. Asch reported that Pavilion Rentals amounted to \$102.00 for the past month.

NEW BUSINESS:

Dr. Withington spoke on the subject of Football, regarding the past season, and on further athletic activities in the Club.

Mr. Bailey reported that the receipts from the Football Games amounted to \$1400.00 and that the disbursements were \$1600.00.

As the Outrigger team had the honor of playing the University of Nevada team on New Year's Day, it required an added expenditure of some two hundred odd dollars, and as there was no division of gate receipts, the treasurer, upon motion of Mr. Deverill, seconded by Mr. Graves, was empowered to endeavor to collect the money expended in preparing the Outrigger team for the Nevada game. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Deverill and seconded by Mr. Graves, that the board extend a vote of thanks to Dr. Withington for his efforts in putting out Outrigger Football team. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Bailey and seconded by Mr. Deverill, that the Football Team be given a dinner at the Elks Club and that the arrangements be left in the hands of the Order & Entertainment Committee. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Asch and seconded by Mr. Graves, that the Secretary be instructed to write a letter to the Board of Harbor Commissioners, asking as to what provisions

Moved that all bills properly O.K.'d were to be paid. It was moved by Mr. Mooney and seconded by Mr. Center. Carried.

A.H. Ford was appointed a committee of one, with power to add to same for purpose of looking in the renewing leases or what ever action necessary. Carried.

Mrs. G. Wright's resignation was accepted and Mrs. A. May was appointed in her stead.

The Directors voted a complimentary Guest Card for a years privilege of the club from April 1st. 1921 for Mrs. Wright.

A locker fee, however, which is charged against only those members who desire the use of a private locker is not a membership fee and is not subject to tax.

AT A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE TRIGGER CANOE CLUB,  
TO BE CALLED FOR THAT PURPOSE, A MOTION WILL BE  
MADE TO AMEND THE BY-LAWS OF THE CLUB AS FOLLOWS:

Section 2:

The purpose of the Club shall be to maintain suitable premises on the beach for the recreation of its members, and to encourage outdoor life and sports along shore, including surfing in canoes and on the boards, swimming, diving and other aquatic sports and exercises.

Change:

Strike out the word Aquatic and insert the word Amateur.

Section 13:

Said officers shall be elected at the annual meeting and shall hold office for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Change:

At the annual meeting in July, 1921, three (3) directors shall be elected for a period of three (3) years, three (3) for a period of two (2) years, and three (3) for a period of one (1) year and at each annual meeting hereafter three (3) directors shall be elected for a period of three (3) years. The directors shall, at their first meeting after the annual meeting of the club, elect from their own membership the officers designated in section eleven (12).

Section 26:

He shall attend to the correspondence of the Club and keep a file thereof, and perform all the duties usually appertaining to the office of Secretary.

Change:

*New Sec. 26* He shall receive all money paid to the Club and shall pay the same over to the treasurer. He shall keep, in proper books, an accurate account of all money received by him.

Section 27:

The Treasurer shall receive and have the custody of all Club funds.

Change:

The treasurer shall receive from the secretary and have the custody of all club funds.

Section 29:

He shall keep in proper books an accurate account of all moneys received and expended and shall exhibit such books to any person entitled to inspect the same.

Change:

After the words "inspect the same" add, "provided however that if one assistant is employed for both the secretary and the treasurer one such set of books shall be sufficient for both officers."

Section 33:

He shall encourage and assist the members of the Club to become proficient in canoeing, surfing, swimming, diving and other water sports, and shall use his best efforts to induce members to take part in water sports and to enter as contestants in swimming and other aquatic competitions.

Change:

He shall encourage and assist the members of the Club to become proficient in canoeing, surfing, swimming, diving, and other sports, and shall use his best efforts to induce members to take part in such sports and to enter as contestants in such competitions as may be authorized by the Board of Directors.



Section 34:

The House Committee shall consist of three or more members, the chairman of which shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Club and the other members appointed by the Board of Directors.

Change:

Strike out, "at the annual meeting of the club", and insert, as provided in section 13.

Section 39:

It shall purchase all provision and articles necessary for the usual and current operation of the Club.

Change:

Strike out the words, "usual and current".

Section 42:

The Order and Entertainment Committee shall consist of three or more members. the chairman of which shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Club and the other members appointed by the Board of Directors.

Change:

Strike out the words, " at the annual meeting of the Club;" and insert, "as provided in section 13.

Section 46:

Applications for membership shall be made upon the printed form provided for that purpose by the Club, and shall be signed by the applicant and also by two senior members of the Club as proposer and seconder. All applications for membership shall be delivered to the treasurer of the club.

Change:

Strike out the word, "treasurer" and insert the word, "secretary".

Section 47:

Applications for senior membership shall be accompanied by an application fee of \$10.00 and dues at the rate of \$1.00 per month from and including the month in which such application is made until the 30th day of June following, provided however that no applicant shall be required to pay more than \$10.00 in dues in any one fiscal year.

Change:

Strike out the word \$10.00, and insert \$25.00.

Strike out the word \$1.00 per month and insert \$12.00 per year.

Section 51:

All applications for membership shall be presented to the Board of Directors, whereupon said Board of Directors shall have the power to elect or reject such applicant, or to postpone action on any application for such time or times as it shall see fit. In the event of any application being rejected, all money or moneys paid by or on behalf of such rejected applicant shall be returned by the Treasurer to the proper person.

Change:

Insert after, "Shall see fit", All applications for membership or guest privileges shall be posted in one or more conspicuous places on the club grounds for a period of at least one week.

Section 52: *as amended Nov, 1916*

~~Temporary residents of the Territory of Hawaii may, upon the application of any senior member to the Treasurer be admitted to the privileges of the Club as the guest of such member for a term of from one to three months, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. An extension of the limit of three months may be granted by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors.~~

After signed by the member; add, "and shall be accompanied by such fees as may from time to time be determined by the Board of Directors".

Section 53:

All Club dues shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Club and shall be payable July 1 of each year for one year in advance.

Any member who may be absent from the Island of Oahu for a continuous period of not less than six months or more than 18 months, and who shall first notify the Secretary of his intended absence, shall upon his return, be entitled to a rebate of his dues covering the time of his absence (in which case no locker shall be reserved for him), and shall not forfeit his membership in the club by reason of such absence, provided proper notice has been given.

Change:

Any member who may be absent from the Island of Oahu for a continuous period of not less than six months or more than 18 months, and who shall, before leaving the islands give written notice to the secretary of his intended absence (in which case no locker shall be reserved for him) shall, upon his return to the Island of Oahu, be entitled to the privileges of the club for a period of time equal to the time for which his dues were paid and shall not forfeit his membership in the club by reason of such absence.

Section 59:

Any member who resigns from the Club and leaves the Island of Oahu may, upon his return, within twelve months from the date of his resignation be readmitted to membership in the Club without the payment of an application fee.

Section 67:

Every member shall be entitled to entertain guests in the Club grounds, and to extend bathing and dressing room privileges to not more than twelve guests each year.
