

# TRIALS SCRATCHED AS ENTRIES CLOSE; OLGA CLARK IS OUT

City Wide, Outrigger, Enter Crack Swimmers; Diving Event for Women Is Taken Off

## The Program

HERE will be no trials held for any of the events of the Hawaiian Open championship swimming meet to be held Saturday at the Natatorium, it was learned late last night from Victor Ligda, chairman of the games committee of the local A. A. U. body. In a final check up of the entries by Chairman Ligda several changes were announced.

M. Oka of the Nuuanu Y was scratched from the entry list leaving eight contestants, and in view of the fact that the number of divers could be handled, Ligda canceled the scheduled trials for today.

Added to the list of swimmers were the entries of the Honolulu Harbor Defense, Citywide, Outrigger Canoe Club, and the Hilo T. H. S. Club.

Olga Clark, it was learned, will not compete in the meet, but may enter in the other two meets.

This leaves the Women's 100 meter Hawaiian championship to be contested by Mildred Slaght Hooper, Gladys Slaght, Loretta Gillispie, and Miss K. Bull.

This four-cornered race will be one of the most exciting of the evening; Mildred Hooper is in the peak of training, having never let down since her victory in the Open swims last May. Her sister Gladys, although younger, is always on her heels during the practice swims and is capable of putting up a performance as good as Mildred's.

Loretta Gillispie, it will be remembered, placed a close second to Mildred in the May swims and with the training she has accomplished during the last four months will undoubtedly be a serious threat.

Miss K. Bull of Waiialua, while never seen in action, has many enthusiastic backers who predict that in the final count her name will be seen high.

### NO DIVING FOR WOMEN

It was further learned that the diving event for women will be canceled from the list, as there was but one entry turned in for it. This is regrettable as it was hoped by the games committee to make it a Ha-

waiian championship event.
