

No Trials Necessary In Championship Swim Events

No trials will be held today for the Hawaiian championship swims which are to be staged Saturday afternoon at the war memorial natatorium. This was announced last night by Victor Ligda, chairman of the games committee.

The only event which would have required elimination was the Hawaiian championship springboard diving but with the scratching of Mitsuji Oka of the Nuuanu "Y" the number of contestants makes it unnecessary to have trials.

Another development yesterday was Olga Clark's certainty of not competing in Saturday's meet. However, there is a possibility that she will show in the other two meets.

Officials were hoping for her to swim in the women's Hawaiian championship event in the 100 meters against Mildred Hooper and Gladys Slaght. Loretta Gillespie, who showed up well a couple of years ago, entered the meet late yesterday and will swim unattached in the 100 meters.

Real Competition

A. Desha of Hilo and winner of the last big breaststroke race here, will find some hot competition from Richard Sutton, unattached and former Punahou splasher and also from Ah Kong Pang of the Hui Nalu.

With the Hui Makani club out of the race, the battle for team honors

will be fought out among the two Army entries, Luke Field, Harbor Defense, Waialua A. C. (Citywide); Outrigger Canoe Club, Forty and Eight and Citywide A. C.

For the man and woman accumulating the most points in the championship events will be given a trophy. Other forms of recognition to the victors in the other races will be certificates.

The meet will open at 4:30 p. m. Saturday, with the 100 meters freestyle for men, a Hawaiian championship event.

Admission to the meet will be free and a big crowd is expected to see the races.
