

High Diving Is Dropped For Women By A. A. U.

Mildred Hooper Leading In Individual Scoring

VICTOR LIGDA, chairman of the games committee of the Hawaiian A. A. U., announced yesterday that the women's high diving event would be dropped from the program of the second meet of the Hawaiian Open Championship swims to be held Saturday at the Natatorium. In its stead will be placed an exhibition of platform diving by men. This is the second event in the women's diving that has been dropped by the games committee because of a lack of entries.

Ligda also explained the scoring system of the meet.

Only points earned in the championship events will count for the team and individual scores. This applies to the men and women alike. Points in the relay events are 10 for first place, six for second, and two for third. In the individual events the system of points are: Five for first, three for second, and one for third.

MEDALS AT STAKE

The men's and women's individual high point medals will be presented to the winners of individual Hawaiian championships. Relays will not be counted in the individual scorings. There will be a team trophy for the team scoring the highest number of points in the championship events. It has been decided that the combined teams of the Army will be regarded as the Army team. The outdoor swims that were held last May on Decoration day will be counted in the totaling of individual and team scores.

Prizes will be awarded directly after the last meet that is to be held September 9.
