Only points earned in the championship events will count for the team and individual scores. This applies to the men and women alike. Points in the relay events are 10 for first place, six for second, and two for third. In the individual events the system of points are: Five for first, three for second, and one for third.

MEDALS AT STAKE The men's and women's individual high point medals will be presented to the winners of individual Hawaiian championships. Relays will not be counted in the individual scor-ings. There will be a team trophy for the team scoring the highest number of points in the championship events. It has been decided that the combined teams of the Army will be door swims that were held last May on Decoration day will be counted in the totaling of individual and scores.
