

NO TRIALS FOR SWIM MEET ON SATURDAY

Big Entry List Recorded; Hawaiian Champion- ships at Stake

THERE will be no trials for the Hawaiian open swimming championships to be held Saturday at 4:30 at the War Memorial Natatorium. Victor Ligda, chairman of the games committee of the A. A. U. body of Hawaii, announced that due to the number of scratches in the scheduled trial events that were to be held today at 4:30 the remaining number of contestants would not be required to compete in the elimination trials.

This is a welcome relief for it is no bed of roses to a swimmer who has to swim his best two days in succession, more especially when the trials and finals are in the late afternoon.

In looking over the entries one sees many new organizations. The outstanding of these are the Army teams from Fort Kamehameha, Fort Ruger and the entry of the University of Hawaii. Francis "Fanny" King, the demon back stroker of "Pump" Searle's aquatic squadron and first mate of the Ohiki Maru, well known in the Waikiki waters, will uphold the honor of the Varsity in the 220-yard backstroke Hawaiian Championship event.

"Fanny" in an interview yesterday said that he had been swimming backstroke so long that he has to scrape the barnacles off his back at least once a week. He modestly attributed it to his being the bilge keel for the Ohiki Maru whenever it strikes a heavy wind, but those in the know say it is from backstroke.
