Mildred was in the best of condition, finishing the last lap with plenty of power and style.

NEW SERVICE MARK

Waidlich of the Honolulu Harbor Defense in the 100 meter Freestyle Service smacked his own record of 1:06.2 glimmering, when he thrashed his way to victory in the century to the time of 1:05.4. Waldlich swam a strong race and was plenty peppy at the finish.

He was a body length ahead of his nearest rival, Lucier. Waidlich had been trailing the Service field for time and the swimming fans getting worried, but he re-i their confidence when he stored their confidence when ne proved to them that he was not on the slide, down hill, by winning the century in record breaking time. Waldlich is the only "letter man" that Coach Corn of the Harbor Defense Team has, and is well known to the local swimming realm.
